E-Book Visually Details Pearl Harbor Attack

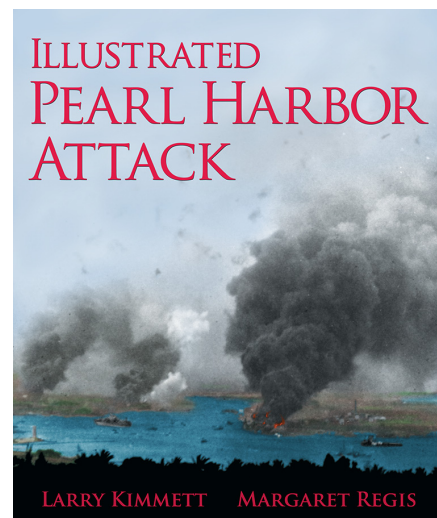
Bellingham, WA – November 16, 2011—New on the electronic bookshelves to commemorate the 70th anniversary of the attack on Pearl Harbor, the e-book **Illustrated Pearl Harbor Attack** by Larry Kimmett and Margaret Regis, presents a visual history of the surprise Japanese raid of December 7th, 1941 that thrust the United States into World War II.

In a refreshing change from the quickly-adapted all-text World War II e-books that so far dominate the arena, **Illustrated Pearl Harbor Attack** intersperses hundreds of photos and illustrations throughout the text to create a vivid picture of the actions that day. Clear, backlit historical photos show details of the attack that can't be seen in print versions.

“We wanted to present the attack in the most visual way possible,” said Kimmett, who adapted this e-book from his acclaimed history, *The Attack on Pearl Harbor: An Illustrated History*. “The e-book format brings a great clarity to the historical photos. It makes the action so much more immediate.” In addition to photos, the e-book includes scores of color maps and diagrams that graphically show what happened at every part of the attack.

Opening with a short background on the Japanese empire, **Illustrated Pearl Harbor Attack** explores the reasons for the Japanese raid and provides minute-by-minute visual coverage of the assault at Pearl Harbor and the air bases on Oahu. The e-book also discusses some of the mysteries surrounding the attack, such as why Americans failed to act on crucial early warnings, and how the Japanese were able to mount and carry off this militarily difficult raid. Battle diagrams, coupled with captured Japanese photographs, follow the attack-in-progress to give a pilot's view of the torpedo and bombing strikes on the U.S. Pacific Fleet.

Illustrated Pearl Harbor Attack devotes special attention to the loss of the USS *Arizona*. Diagrams of the events of the battleship's destruction, paired with a dramatic sequence of photographs of the bombing, show *Arizona's* actual magazine



explosion. In the course of their research, the authors located a lost 1942 underwater survey of the sunken battleship and created an original drawing of *Arizona's* damage.

Illustrated Pearl Harbor Attack e-book includes 214 historic photos, color drawings, and maps, and is formatted for iPad, Nook and Kindle e-readers. The e-book is available at:
